The Importance Of Critical Thinking

In a seminal study on critical thinking

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and education in 1941, Edward Glaser defines critical thinking as follows “The ability to think critically, as conceived in this volume, involves three things: (1) an attitude of being disposed to consider in a thoughtful way the problems and subjects that come within the range of one's experiences, (2) knowledge of the methods of logical inquiry and

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reasoning, and (3) some skill in applying those methods.
